



On March 8th, 2006 — International Women's Day — join the Women's Health Research Network in a videoconference to talk about women's health.

The topic for the day will be women's health surveillance: How should women's health be measured and what are good indicators of women's health?

This discussion is happening around the world and has implications for researchers, policy makers, women's health advocates and women themselves. This discussion will support one of the goals of the Provincial Women's Health Strategy — to improve women's health surveillance in British Columbia.
